Important Reminders

ANTH majors must earn at least a 2.0 GPA in both the major and overall GPA.

Federal financial aid can be used to improve a grade of D or higher *only once* for a given course. If you retake a course to replace a D or higher for the second time and are receiving Federal financial aid, be sure to enroll in at least 12 additional credits to maintain full-time status.

Credit at other institutions

You may complete up to 12 credits of general electives at other schools *with advance permission from the appropriate Department Chair and Dean's Office*. The *last 30 credits* must be taken at Seton Hall.
