The Fulbright Scholar Program

Background

- Created in 1946 by U.S. Congress
- Sponsored by the U.S. Department of State's Bureau of Educational and Cultural Affairs (ECA), as its flagship program
- In the United States, the Fulbright U.S. Scholar Program is managed by the Institute of International Education (IIE).
- Implemented by bi-national Commissions and U.S. Embassies abroad.
- Supports research, teaching, seminar attendance, and professional projects abroad in 120+ countries





Three Key Features of the Fulbright U.S. Scholar Program



1. **Unmatched Scale:** With nearly 800 awards granted annually, Fulbright is the largest fellowship program available to U.S. scholars
2. **A Mission of Connection:** As a flagship public diplomacy initiative, Fulbright is dedicated to fostering long-term international relationships and mutual understanding
3. **Broad Range of Opportunities:** With more than 400 unique awards, the program offers options to suit nearly every academic discipline, methodology, institution type, and career stage

Qualifications for U.S. Scholar

- **U.S. citizenship**
- **Degree and experience**, as required by award:
 - Ph.D. or other terminal degree
 - Master's or professional or artistic experience
 - Teaching experience as required
- **Fulbright U.S. Scholar alums are eligible:**
Recipients of a Fulbright Scholar grant are eligible to apply for another Fulbright Scholar grant two years after the date of completion of the previous grant

Awards for Seminars

- International Education Administrator (IEA) Awards





International Education Administrator (IEA) Awards

- **Funded** two-week seminars for administrators (**staff** and leadership) with international education responsibilities •
- Check the award requirements tab of the description for country specific requirements
- **Faculty can participate**, but **only** if they serve as an administrator with international responsibilities, such as a president, director, dean or chair
 - IEA awards do not support research or teaching.

Tips for Choosing the Right Fulbright Award

- Choose the **most specific award** that meets your needs
- **Target** your search by country, discipline, or award type
- Explore “**Hidden Gems**” — less competitive but rewarding opportunities
- Check if you're eligible for **Postdoctoral** or **Distinguished Awards**
- Reflect on your **career stage**, field trends, global events, and any **personal or professional constraints** (e.g., ability to take leave)





Selecting the Right Award

- Match your expertise, experience and proposal to the award description
- *Think about competitiveness!*
- Regional experience and language ability
- Discipline preferences listed in the award
- Relevance of the project to the country; why will host country benefit from your project?
- Career level - early career, postdoctoral, mid-level, Distinguished Chair





Affiliations and Invitations

Grant Locations:

- If a host is identified, it will be found under Location
- When a host is not identified, there are several resources to help find an affiliation:
 - International office on your campus
 - U.S. and Visiting [Fulbright Scholar Directory](#)
 - Review award description for suggested hosts or resources

Letter of Invitation:

- Non-binding expression of interest from proposed host abroad
- Should come from person with whom you will be collaborating
- Should be on host institution letterhead

Application Components

Requirements:

- ✓ Application Form
- ✓ Project Statement
- ✓ Curriculum Vitae or Resume
- ✓ 2 Recommendations
- ✓ Language Proficiency Report *(if required)*
- ✓ Invitation Letters *(if required)*

Supplemental Materials:

- ✓ Syllabi or Course Outlines *(for teaching)*
- ✓ Reference List *(for research)*
- ✓ Portfolio *(for disciplines like Arts, Architecture, and Journalism)*





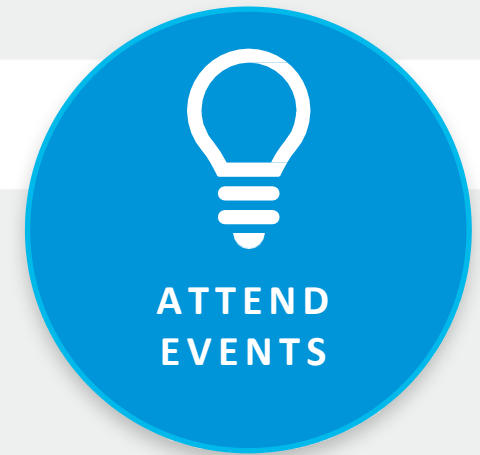
Tips for a strong application:



Read all four tabs of an award so you know which one best meets your needs



Start an online application as **soon as possible**



Attend webinars and Office Hours and read guides on our website

Application Cycle

FEBRUARY	Competition Opens
SEPTEMBER 15	Application Deadline
SEPTEMBER	IIE staff conducts Preliminary Screening
OCTOBER – NOVEMBER	U.S. Peer Review
DECEMBER	Applicants notified of Peer Review result
DECEMBER – JUNE	Selection process takes place and notifications sent
JUNE – ONWARD	Participants are selected and prepare for departure
