Global Climate Change: Conflict and Cooperation

The impact of global climate change in the past decade has raised serious concerns about disease control, food and water security, resource scarcity, migration, and given rise to diverse interpretations of the responsibility of states to respond to evolving climate dilemmas. The extreme effects of climate change have caused states to rethink their own domestic policies as well as how they approach climate change diplomatically to protect the environment.

However, climate change has also drawn conflict within and between states. As some decision-makers argue humans have little impact on environmental degradation, others are claiming the Paris Agreement did not go far enough. The cleavage between those advocating for and against environmental policy changes demonstrates the potential for global climate change to be the seminal challenge of the twenty-first century.

As climate change impacts every nation of the world to some degree, confronting and analyzing environmental issues becomes increasingly important as we look to the future.

For our 21st issue, the Journal of Diplomacy is accepting articles which cover topics related to global climate change. This includes subtopics ranging from climate-induced conflict or cooperation, migration, economics, and security. Submissions should be between 3,000 and 6,000 words and are due Monday, 15 October 2018.
