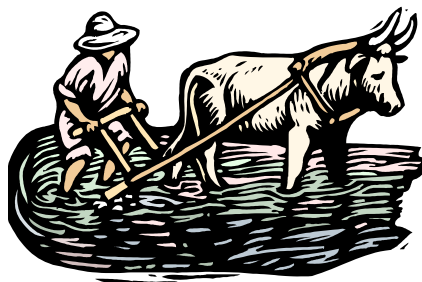


Inheritors
