**Calendar Committee**  
**November 19, 2021 Report**

The Calendar Committee met with Chris Cuccia, Associate Provost for Academic and Graduate Affairs, Bernadette McVey, Director of Academic Events, Initiatives and Planning, and Autumn Bucior, Registrar, on September 24<sup>th</sup> and October 14<sup>th</sup> to plan a calendar that provides for both a Winter Session and a Summer Session III. The Provost wants both sessions to continue.

Summer Session I 2022 was moved to May 31 – July 1. This will allow for Spring embedded travel before Summer Session I begins and also leave time for Summer Session III.

The following 15-day Winter sessions will run the next three years:

2022: January 4 – January 18

2023: January 3 – January 17

2024: January 2 – January 16

The Calendar Committee expressed some apprehension about this very tight schedule. An academic calendar with a winter session and three summer sessions allows very little break for the Registrar's Office, the Deans' Offices, or those faculty teaching. Faculty need time for research endeavors and are concerned about the extent of teaching obligations imposed outside of the Fall and Spring semesters.

The Calendar Committee approved the 2022-2023 and 2023-2024 Academic Calendars in Spring of 2021. Both calendars allow for a Winter Session and three Summer Sessions. The Cabinet approved the 2022-2023 calendar. The Calendar Committee has repeatedly requested that the 2022-2023 calendar be posted and the 2023-2024 calendar be presented for approval and posted.
