Catalog Description:	This program introduces students to the comparative theological study of Islam and Christianity. Following the spirit of Vatican II's <i>Nostra Aetate</i> , this minor aims to foster critical and constructive dialogue between Islam and Christianity through sustained inquiry of each tradition's sophisticated faith commitments and lived religiosities. Thus, this minor focuses primarily on the theological dimensions of each tradition, their historically shared intellectual and spiritual sources, how they are practiced and embodied in various arenas of human life, and the comparative theological methodologies that foster deeper understanding and appreciation for each tradition's religious and ethical distinctiveness and contributions to public life.					
Rationale:	A curricular strength of Seton Hall University is in the area of interfaith studies, anchored by the pioneering work of the Department of Religion's Jewish-Christian Studies Program (JCST). The graduate program in JCST was founded by Monsignor John Oesterreicher who played a pivotal role in the drafting of Vatican II's <i>Nostra</i> <i>Aetate</i> , which revolutionized the Church's relationship with Judaism. Since then, Seton Hall via JCST (and the Sister Rose Thering Fund) has been nationally and internationally known as the place where church leaders, as well as teachers and
