

## APC Report: June 10, 2022

APC met on June 7, 2022. Those present were: Philip Moremen, Peter Reader, Judy Lothian, Joyce Maglione, Sona Patel, Russell Sbriglia, Amy Hunter, Penina Orenstein, Joseph Rice.

### Old Business

The Senate at its last meeting did not have time to address the APC's recommendations on the following program proposals and so APC is submitting them again for the Senate's consideration:

Minor in Muslim-Christian Relations. By a vote of 8-0, the Committee approved the proposed from the Religion Department. The proposal is posted concurrently on the Senate agenda

Joint Degree in Nursing Administration and MBA. APC previously approved, by a vote of 10-0, a proposed Joint Degree Program in Nursing Administration and a Master's of Business Administration, pending receipt of some signatures on the Signature Approval Form. APC has now received those signatures and so passes on the proposal for consideration by the Senate. The proposal is posted concurrently on the Senate agenda.

### New Business

At its June 7 meeting, APC considered a proposal from the College of Education and Human Services to re-design the Police Graduate Studies Program into an M.A. in Law Enforcement Executive Leadership. By a vote of 8-1, APC approved the proposal contingent on the receipt of adequate information on the following topics over the summer, as assessed by APC, with final approval to be provided by the Senate EC:

- Additional information on assessment of course objectives;
- Course descriptions of the required courses;
- Additional and more detailed assessment of the market demand for the program.

The Proposal is posted concurrently on the Senate agenda.

The Committee elected Sona Patel and Amy Hunter as co-chairs for the '22-'23 Senate session.

### Proposed Resolutions

APC submits the following three resolutions for the Senate's consideration:

Resolution: Be it resolved that the proposed minor in Muslim-Christian Relations is approved.

Resolution: Be it resolved that the proposed Joint Degree in Nursing Administration and Master's of Business Administration is approved.

Resolution: Be it resolved that the proposed MA in Law Enforcement Executive Leadership is approved contingent on the receipt by APC co-chairs of adequate information on the following topics over the summer, with final approval provided by the Senate EC:

- Additional information on assessment of course objectives;
- Course descriptions;
- Additional information on internal and external market assessments.
