



Dr. Anthony Koutsoftas, associate professor at Seton Hall University would like to inform you about a research study called Project WILLD (writing in students with language-based learning disabilities) for the 2022-2023 school year.

<u>Who can participate?</u> Speech Language Pathologists and Special Educators working with 4th and 5th grade students with language-based learning disabilities. These are students who have an IEP for Specific Learning Disability or Communication Impairment and receive services in small groups from educators who are SLPs or SEs.

<u>What?</u> Project WILLD is an 18-week intervention (2 times per week) designed to improve writing skills while targeting spoken and written language goals. SLPs and SEs will be randomly assigned to Project WILLD or Business-as-Usual.

When? October 2022 through June 2023

What else? All educators will participate in four professional development sessions throughout the academic year and receive \$500 for their participation at the end of the study. All educators will receive intervention materials including lesson plans and stimuli.
